Today's Readings

The First Reading: Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory." The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!"

The Epistle: Romans 8:12-17

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh-- for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ-- if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

The Gospel Reading: John 3:1-17

There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.'

The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.” Nicodemus said to him, “How can these things be?” Jesus answered him, “Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? “Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. “For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. “Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.





Connections Work, formerly Berks Connections/Pretrial Services (BCPS) is helping to improve lives and create safer, healthier, and more prosperous communities by providing individuals with justice involvement with the tools and support they need to live productive, law-abiding lives. With a focus on workforce development, Connections Work enables individuals to put their best foot forward, helping them land family-sustaining jobs, which lowers the recidivism rate. The impact ripples out to positively impact the health and well-being of their families, their employers, and our community.

Family Promise of Berks County: your local non-profit providing transitional shelter, case management and supports to children, families and youth at risk of homelessness in and throughout Berks County. We offer Hospitality Network, Bridge House, U-turn and Rent and Utility Assistance.

The **LGBT Center of Greater Reading** provides support to the community via groups, events, counseling, education and health services. Please check our Facebook page and our website for our current events.

LightHouse Women and Children's Center is a center for unsheltered single women and women with children on the campus of Hope Rescue Mission in Reading, PA. We transformed a warehouse on our campus that was being used as a thrift store into a beautiful residence with 43 individual rooms.

Mary's Shelter provides housing and social services to homeless, unaccompanied youth and young mothers. In a comfortable and safe home-like setting, we provide the physical, mental, and emotional support they need to heal and move forward in life. Mary's Shelter operates five unique programs. Three programs are residential and provide shelter to young people ages 14 to 21. Two programs are community out-reach services to help prevent homelessness and serve clients of any age. The Maternity Out-reach assist new mothers throughout the pregnancy and for the next three years.

VCOP is a 100% Volunteer 501c3 organization. We help Veterans with food and clothing by distribution at our twice monthly Stand Downs. (Reading and Pottstown 2nd and 4th Saturday respectively.)
