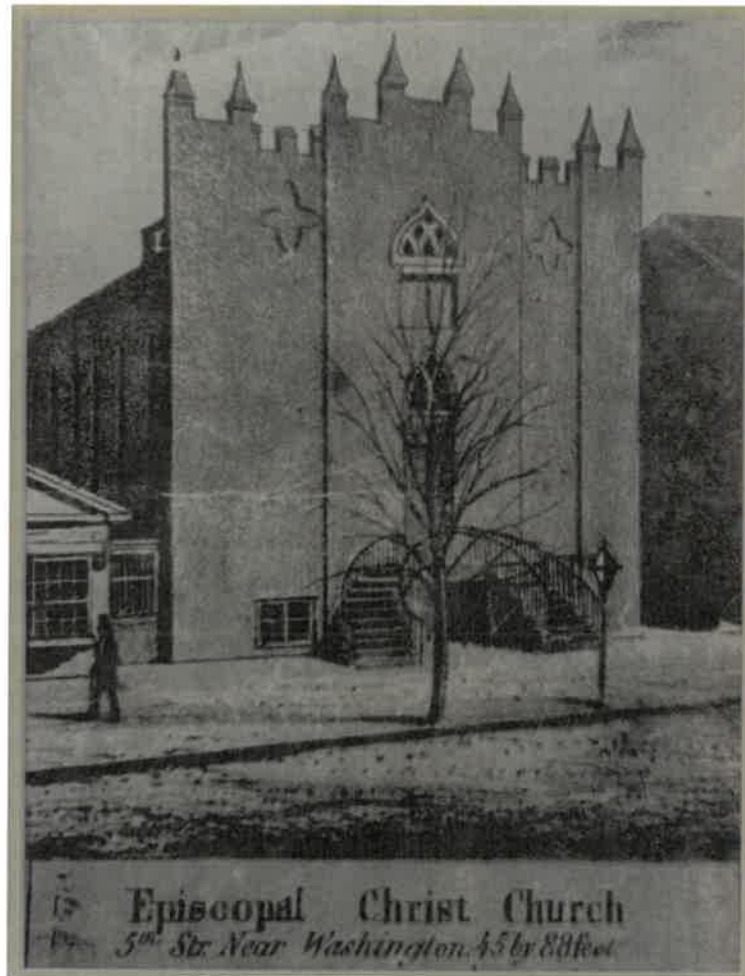

## The Liturgy of the Word

Celebrant: Two hundred years ago, on May 10, 1826, The Right Revd William White, first Bishop of Pennsylvania, consecrated this building as a place of worship to the glory of God. On that day the Diocesan Convention was in session at Christ Church, bringing together the clerical and lay delegates of the Diocese. Today we give thanks for those who laid stone upon stone in this place, for their faith and their dedication to following Christ. Their chief cornerstone remains ours still. Today we rejoice that Christ is still proclaimed, in word and deed, in this place. Let us pray:

Creator God, we thank you for the glory of all you have made, and for the skill that has led people through all centuries to fashion things of beauty, as songs of praise in stone. As we give you thanks for the inspiration that countless pilgrims and visitors have found in this church, open our eyes again, we pray, that renewed in our own wonder for all that is around us, we may praise you in worship, in speaking words of gentleness and in deeds of love, through Jesus Christ, our rock and cornerstone. **Amen.**

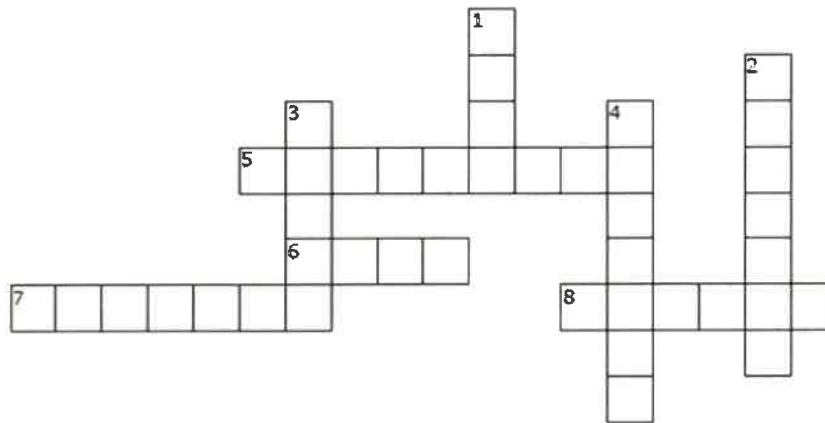
