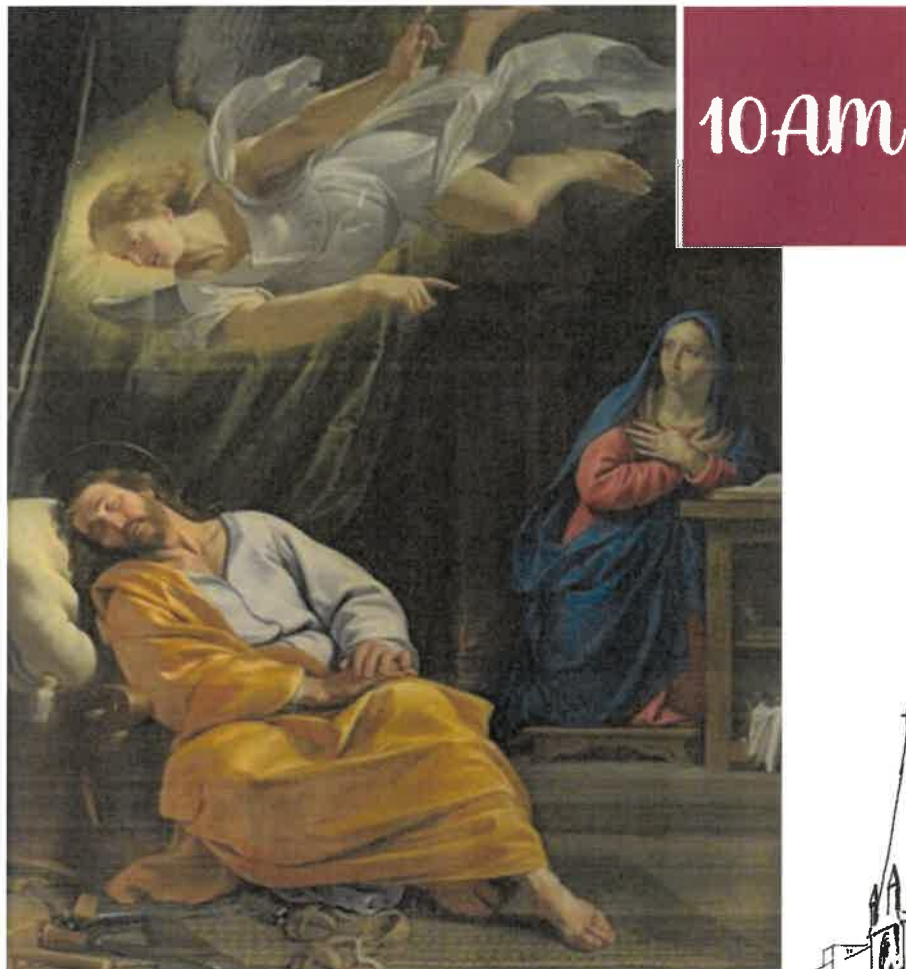

The Liturgy of the Word

Celebrant: Blessed be God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit:

Leader: As we find ourselves on the doorstep of our Lord's nativity, we pray for the courage to knock at the door of Bethlehem and to hear what the messengers of God are saying to us. May we ever be grateful for those who bring glad tidings of great joy into our lives. May we also have the faith and trust exemplified by Blessed Mary to respond "Let it be" when God desires to enter our lives and lead us in new directions. We light this fourth candle of Advent as we look to the heralds of good news and to those who show us how we can follow God more closely and faithfully.

Gospeller: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew:

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: "Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.

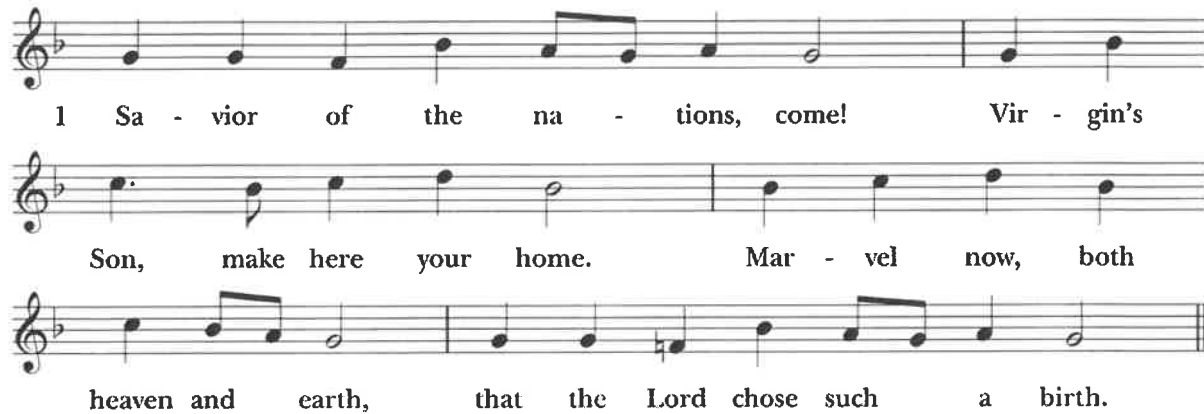

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

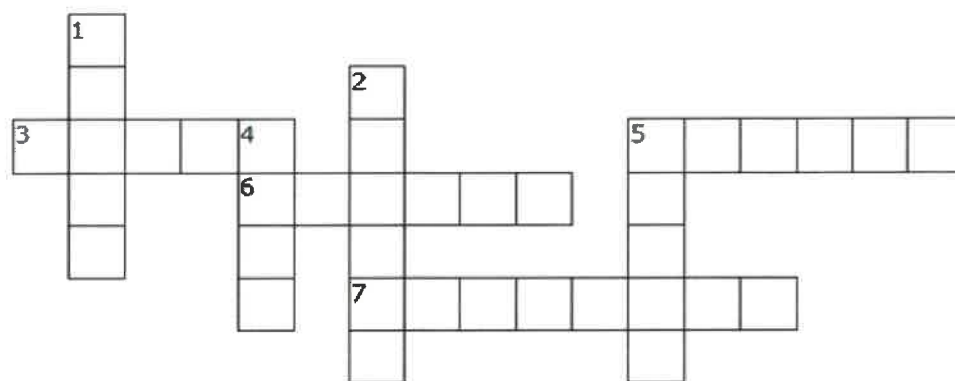

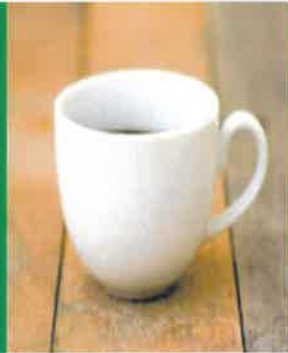
